Notice Of Reporting Requirement for California Biologics Licensed Facilities

Donor Adverse Events

Dear Facility Owner/Director,

Amendment of California Health and Safety Code (HSC) 1607 took effect on January 1, 2023. A blood bank shall annually report to the department any adverse donor event requiring emergency medical intervention. HSC 1607 (3) (A) A blood bank shall annually report to the department any adverse donor events requiring emergency medical intervention that occur pursuant to this subdivision, including the date, location, type of adverse event, onsite response, and whether a registered nurse was physically present on the premises.

The annual blood donor adverse event (DAE) reporting is due by May 1, 2025, for events that occurred on January 1, 2024, thru December 31, 2024. If your facility **does not** collect blood or blood components, the Microsoft Excel DAE reporting spreadsheet template must still be completed and submitted.
