

# Environmental Health Training in Emergency Response

## May 9 & 10, 2012- Foster City, CA



The purpose of this course is to increase the level of emergency preparedness and response of public and environmental health practitioners by providing the necessary knowledge and skills to address the environmental health impacts of disasters. Topics covered will include disaster-related food and drinking water supply, worker health and safety, disaster management, shelter sanitation, debris/solid/hazardous waste handling, vector control, and waste water.

This 2-day course will take place 8:00 am - 5 pm on both days. The course is free and offers 16 hours of continuing education for Registered Environmental Health Specialists made available through the California Environmental Health Association (CEHA).
