

Focus Area 1: Access to Health Care

Objective 1-11: Increase the proportion of persons who have access to rapidly responding pre-hospital emergency medical services. [State Data Sources: National Assessment of State Trauma System Development, Emergency Medical Services Resources, and Disaster Readiness for Mass Casualty Events, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)]

**Objective 1-11a: Population covered by basic life support.
Target = 100.0 percent**

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 90.0 percent of the state's population was covered by basic life support, which is ten percent lower than the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.

**Objective 1-11b: Population covered by advanced life support.
Target = 85.0 percent**

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 98.0 percent of the state's population was covered by advanced life support, which exceeds the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.

Note: In response to inquiries by CDPH, HRSA confirmed their 2002 survey results showing a greater proportion of California's population covered by advanced life support than basic life support. HRSA personnel stated that this could indicate that 8% of California's population had no need for basic life support as they were covered by advanced life support. Objective 1-11c: Population covered by helicopter. Target = 83.0 percent

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 97.0 percent of the state's population was covered by helicopter, which exceeds the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.

Objective 1-11d: Population living in area with pre-hospital access to online medical control. Target = 86.0 percent

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 98.0 percent of the state's population lived in areas with pre-hospital access to online medical control, which exceeds the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.

Objective 1-11e: Population covered by basic 9-1-1. Target = 81.0 percent

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 99.0 percent of the state's population was covered by basic 9-1-1, which exceeds the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.

**Objective 1-11f: Population covered by enhanced 9-1-1.
Target = 79.0 percent**

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 98.0 percent of the state's population was covered by enhanced 9-1-1, which exceeds the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.

Objective 1-11g: Population living in area with two-way communication between hospitals. Target = 75.0 percent

California data available in DATA2010 for 2002 indicate that 98.0 percent of the state's population was living in areas with two-way communication between hospitals, which exceeds the HP2010 target. Data by gender and by race/ethnicity were not available, nor were data for any other years besides 2002.
