

## **Focus Area 10: Food Safety**

**Objective 10-2. Reduce outbreaks of infections caused by key foodborne bacteria. [State Data Source: State Health Department passive reports to CDC and sites participating in FoodNet active surveillance]**

**Objective 10-2a. *Escherichia coli* O157:H7. Target = 11 (U.S. population)**

California data provided by the CDHS Infectious Diseases Branch show one *E. coli* O157:H7 outbreak in 2000 involving 14 cases, eight hospitalizations, and no deaths (<http://ww2.cdph.ca.gov/data/statistics/Pages/CDdata.aspx>).

During 2006, California experienced an *E. coli* O157:H7 outbreak involving 205 confirmed illnesses, 103 hospitalizations, and three deaths associated with contaminated pre-packaged spinach (<http://www.cdph.ca.gov/HealthInfo/Pages/FDB%20Environmental%20Investigation%20Reports.aspx>).

**Objective 10-2b. *Salmonella* serotype Enteritidis. Target = 22 (U.S. population)**

California data provided by the CDHS Infectious Diseases Branch show six *Salmonella* Enteritidis outbreaks in 2000 involving 155 cases, seven hospitalizations, and no deaths. This represents a decline from 14 outbreaks reported in California during 1999 involving 373 cases, 27 hospitalizations, and no deaths.
