CITATION FOR VIOLATION

OF

COMPLIANCE ORDER NO. 03-23-12O-006

Issued: November 6, 2013

Section 116650 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the issuance of a citation for failure to comply with the requirements of Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4 (California Safe Drinking Water Act), or any regulations, permit, standard, or order, issued or adopted thereunder.

The California Department of Public Health, Division of Drinking Water and Environmental Management ("Department") hereby issues a citation to the Doyal's Mobile

1 Home Park Water System, Public Water System No. 1000405, (“Water System”) for
2 failure to comply with requirements of Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006
3 (“Compliance Order”), in particular, Order No. 1, 2, 4, and 9, thereof.
4

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6 **APPLICABLE AUTHORITIES**

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8 **Section 116555 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in part:**

9 Any person who owns a public water system shall ensure that the system does all of the
10 following:

- 11 (a) Complies with primary and secondary drinking water standards.
12 (c) Provides a reliable and adequate supply of pure, wholesome, healthful, and
13 potable water.
14

15
16 **Section 116650 of the Health and Safety Code provides:**

- 17 (a) If the Department determines that a public water system is in violation of this
18 chapter, or any regulation, permit, standard, citation, or order issued or adopted
19 thereunder, the Department may issue a citation to the public water system. The
20 citation shall be served upon the public water system personally or by certified
21 mail. Service shall be deemed effective as of the date of personal service or the
22 date of receipt of the certified mail. If a person to whom a citation is directed
23 refuses to accept delivery of the certified mail, the date of service shall be
24 deemed to be the date of mailing.
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1 (b) Each citation shall be in writing and shall describe the nature of the violation or
2 violations, including a reference to the statutory provision, standard, order,
3 citation, permit, or regulation alleged to have been violated.

4 (c) A citation may specify a date for elimination or correction of the condition
5 constituting the violation.

6 (d) A citation may include the assessment of a penalty as specified in subdivision
7 (e).

8 (e) The Department may assess a penalty in an amount not to exceed one thousand
9 dollars (\$1,000) per day for each day that a violation continues to occur. A
10 separate penalty may be assessed for each violation.
11

12
13 **STATEMENT OF FACTS**
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15
16 The Water System currently operates under a water supply permit issued by the Fresno
17 County Department of Health (“County”) on May 14, 1985. The Water System is a small
18 community water system serving a residential population of 33 persons through 18
19 residential service connections. The Water System utilizes raw groundwater under the
20 direct influence of surface water (“GWUDI”), obtained from a single groundwater well
21 adjacent to the Kings River, as the sole source of domestic water supply. Use of a GWUDI
22 source requires full and approved multibarrier treatment, as specified in the Surface Water
23 Treatment Rule, California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Section 64653.
24

25
26 The Department issued the Compliance Order, included as Attachment A of this Citation,
27 to the Water System on May 1, 2013, for operating a GWUDI source without approved

1 multibarrier treatment, as required under the Surface Water Treatment Rule. Specifically,
2 the Compliance Order was issued for violations of the California Code of Regulations,
3 Title 22, Sections 64652, 64653, and 64654, as well as Health and Safety Code Section
4 116555. As stated above, this citation is being issued to the Water System for violation of
5 the Compliance Order. Specifically, the Water System has failed to comply with Order
6 Nos. 1, 2, 4, and 9 of the Compliance Order.
7

8
9 Order No. 1 of the Compliance Order required the Water System to cease and desist from
10 violating California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Sections 64652, 64653, and 64654, as
11 well as Health and Safety Code Section 116555. The violation of Order No. 1 is still
12 ongoing.
13

14
15 Order No. 2 of the Compliance Order required the Water System to submit a plan and time
16 schedule for improvements to resolve the violations. During a meeting with the Water
17 System in February 2012, the Water System indicated a tentative plan to construct a
18 replacement well. Since that meeting, no further information or correspondence has been
19 received. The Department has not received a plan and time schedule from the Water
20 System. The violation of Order No. 2 is still ongoing.
21

22
23 Pursuant to Order No. 4 of the Compliance Order, the Water System is required to provide
24 4-log virus inactivation through disinfection as an interim solution to the GWUDI
25 treatment violations. On July 11, 2012, the Department approved the Water System to
26 operate the interim disinfection treatment system in response to this requirement. On
27 September 13, 2012, the Department conducted a site visit of the Water System, and

1 during this visit, the Department noted that the Water System had no chlorine solution on
2 site and that there was no chlorine residual in the distribution system. Chlorine residuals
3 are not reported with the monthly coliform analytical results as required. A Boil Water
4 Order, originally issued with the Compliance Order, was reissued on December 27, 2012,
5 and will remain in place until the Water System reliably maintains the 4-log virus
6 inactivation through the disinfection process, as overseen by a certified water treatment
7 operator. The violation of Order No. 4 is still ongoing.

9
10 The Water System is operating without a state-certified operator, as required by Order No.
11 9 of the Compliance Order. The violation of Order No. 9 is still ongoing.

12
13
14 By letter dated September 13, 2013, and sent via certified mail, the Department notified the
15 Water System of the requirement to attend an office hearing to discuss progress, if any,
16 made toward compliance with the Compliance Order. The certified letter was unclaimed
17 by the Water System and returned to the Department. The Water System failed to attend
18 the scheduled office hearing.

19
20 Additional ongoing violations not addressed in this Citation include: multiple monitoring
21 and reporting violations of the Total Coliform Rule, multiple failures to prepare and
22 distribute an annual Consumer Confidence Report, multiple annual nitrate monitoring and
23 reporting violations, multiple failures to submit an annual report, monitoring and reporting
24 violations of the Lead and Copper Rule, and operating a water system without an
25 appropriately certified water distribution operator.
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1 **DETERMINATIONS**

2
3 The Department has determined that the Water System has failed to comply with the
4 following Orders within Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006.
5

6
7 **Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, Order No. 1**

8 Cease and Desist from failing to comply with Title 22, CCR Sections 64652, 64653,
9 64654, and CHSC Section 116555.
10

11 **Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, Order No. 2**

12 By July 1, 2012, the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System shall submit to the
13 Department, for review and approval, a plan for improvements to provide an alternate
14 source of potable water or to comply with all SWTR requirements and eliminate the need
15 to deliver water to consumers that does not meet the treatment requirements as specified
16 under the SWTR. The plan shall include a time schedule for completion of various phases
17 of the project, such as evaluation of alternatives, selection of project, design, construction,
18 and startup.
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21 **Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, Order No. 4**

22 Until a permanent solution is completed, the Water System shall provide 4-log virus
23 inactivation through continuous disinfection of Well 01. The Department will provide the
24 Water System with the permitting requirements necessary before activation of any
25 treatment or change in source, via a subsequent correspondence.
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1 **Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, Order No. 9**

2 The Water System shall maintain, at a minimum, a T1 and D1 certified operator, in
3 accordance with Enforcement Letter No. 03-23-12E-008, issued by the Department on
4 January 30, 2012, for failure to maintain an appropriately certified operator. The T1
5 certified treatment operator shall provide operational oversight and control of the
6 disinfection treatment required under Order No. 4 above.
7

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9
10 **PENALTIES PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 116650**

11
12 The Department hereby assesses upon the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System a
13 penalty of one thousand and five hundred dollars (\$1,500), pursuant to the California
14 Health and Safety Code, Section 116650(e)(3).
15

16
17 **DIRECTIVES**

18
19 The Water System is hereby directed to take the following actions:
20

- 21
22 1. The Water System shall immediately comply with all requirements and orders
23 described in Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, provided as Attachment A.

24 Specifically, the Water System shall take the following actions:

- 25 a. Cease and Desist from failing to comply with Title 22, CCR Sections
26 64652, 64653, 64654, and CHSC Section 116555.
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b. The Water System shall submit to the Department, for review and approval, a plan for improvements to provide an alternate source of potable water or to comply with all SWTR requirements and eliminate the need to deliver water to consumers that does not meet the treatment requirements as specified under the SWTR. The plan shall include a time schedule for completion of various phases of the project, such as evaluation of alternatives, selection of project, design and construction, and startup.

c. Until a permanent solution is in place, the Water System shall provide 4-log virus inactivation through continuous disinfection of Well 01.

d. The Water System shall maintain, at a minimum, a T1 and D1 certified operator, in accordance with Enforcement Letter No. 03-23-12E-008, issued by the Department on January 30, 2012, for failure to maintain an appropriately certified operator. The T1 certified water treatment operator shall provide operational oversight and control of the disinfection treatment required under Order No. 4 of the Compliance Order.

2. **Effective immediately**, the Water System shall provide notice to all users notifying them to boil their water for drinking and cooking. The Water System shall immediately distribute the Boil Water Order, provided as Attachment B. The Boil Water Order shall remain in place until such a time that a department-approved disinfection treatment is activated and reliably achieves a the 4-log virus inactivation, as required under Order No. 4 of the Compliance Order.

1 3. By **November 30, 2013**, the Water System shall schedule and attend an office
2 hearing regarding Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, and at which, the plan
3 for improvements shall be presented for review and shall address all requirements
4 specified in Directive Nos. 1(b), (c), and (d) of this Citation.
5

6
7 4. **The Water System is directed to pay the penalty of \$1,500 within 60 days of**
8 **receipt of this citation.** Payments shall be made by check payable to the *California*
9 *Department of Public Health Safe Drinking Water Account* with the number of this
10 Citation (Citation No. 03-23-13C-048) written on the check. A “Notice of Citation
11 Issuance” is included as Attachment C to this citation that instructs the Water
12 System on how payment of the penalty is to be made. **However, the requirement**
13 **to pay the penalty shall be suspended if the Water System complies with**
14 **Directive Nos. 1(b), (c), (d), 2, and 3 of this Citation, by December 31, 2013.**
15
16

17 The Department reserves the right to make such modifications to this Citation, as it may
18 deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modifications may be issued as
19 amendments to this Citation, and shall be deemed effective upon issuance.
20

21 Nothing in this Citation relieves the Water System of its obligation to meet the requirements
22 of Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4 (California Safe Drinking
23 Water Act), or any regulation, permit, standard, or order issued or adopted thereunder.
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26 All submittals required by this Citation, excluding payment of the penalty, shall be
27 submitted to the Department at the following address:

PARTIES BOUND

This Citation shall apply to and be binding upon the Water System, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, successors, and assignees.

SEVERABILITY

The Directives of this Citation are severable, and the Water System shall comply with each and every provision thereof, notwithstanding the effectiveness of any other provision.

FURTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION

Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4 (commencing with Section 116270) of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the Department to: issue additional citations with assessment of penalties if the Water System continues to fail to correct a violation identified in a citation; to take action to suspend or revoke a permit that has been issued to a public water system if the system has violated applicable law or regulations or has failed to comply with orders of the Department; and, to petition the court to take various enforcement measures against a public water system that has failed to comply with orders

1 of the Department. The Department does not waive any further enforcement action with
2 the issuance of this citation.

**COMPLIANCE ORDER FOR NONCOMPLIANCE
WITH THE SURFACE WATER TREATMENT RULE**

Issued on May 1, 2012

Section 116655, Chapter 4 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the issuance of an Order for failure to comply with a requirement of the California Safe Drinking Water Act, or any regulation, standard, permit, or order issued thereunder.

FINDINGS

The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System (hereinafter 'Water System') is a community water system located in Fresno County that supplies domestic water to



1 approximately 33 permanent residents through 18 service connections. The Water System
2 currently operates under a domestic water supply permit issued by the Fresno County
3 Department of Health (hereinafter 'County') on May 14, 1985. As of September 1, 2007,
4 the County transferred the jurisdiction for regulatory oversight of this water system to the
5 California Department of Public Health - Drinking Water Program (hereinafter
6 'Department').
7

8
9 The Water System utilizes water from a single well, with no treatment, as the sole source
10 of water supply. Use of Well 01 was approved via the 1985 County issued permit. In a
11 Water System Evaluation and Inspection Report dated January 12, 2011, the Department
12 identified concerns regarding the construction and location of Well 01. Specifically, the
13 Department recognized well and site characteristics that may indicate that Well 01
14 produces groundwater under the direct influence of surface water (hereinafter 'GWUDI').
15
16

17 Well 01 was constructed in 1984 by Johnson Drilling Company, using the casing hammer
18 method. The well was installed through cobble stone to 30 feet and broken schist rock
19 through the remaining depth. The well was constructed with a 33 foot annular seal, which
20 does not satisfy the minimum 50 foot requirements of the California Waterworks
21 Standards. The length from 33 feet through the remaining depth of 400 feet is an open bore
22 hole. Well 01 is located between the primary channel of the Kings River and a seasonal
23 stream. Both water bodies are approximately 150 feet from the well. The Department has
24 deemed Well 01 to be GWUDI.
25
26
27



1 California Code of Regulations (hereinafter 'CCR'), Section 64651.10 defines approved
2 surface water as either surface water or GWUDI that has received permit approval in
3 accordance with California Health and Safety Code (hereinafter 'CHSC'), Sections 116525
4 through 116550.
5

6
7 CCR Section 64652(a) specifies that each supplier using an approved surface water source
8 shall provide multibarrier treatment that meets the requirements of the Surface Water
9 Treatment Rule (hereinafter 'SWTR') and reliably ensures that at least a total of 99.9
10 percent (3.0-log) reduction of *Giardia* cysts and 99.99 percent (4.0-log) reduction of
11 viruses is achieved through filtration and disinfection.
12

13
14 CCR Section 64653(a) specifies that all approved surface water utilized by a supplier shall
15 be treated using conventional filtration, direct filtration, diatomaceous earth filtration or
16 slow sand filtration unless an alternative process has been approved by the Department,
17 pursuant to subsections (f), (g) and (h).
18

19
20 CCR Section 64654(a) requires that all approved surface water utilized by a supplier shall
21 be provided with continuous disinfection treatment sufficient to insure that the total
22 treatment process provides inactivation of *Giardia lamblia* cysts and viruses, in
23 conjunction with the removals obtained through filtration, to meet the reduction
24 requirements specified in Section 64652(a).
25
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1 CCR Section 64666(a) requires a surface water system to notify its consumers whenever
2 there is a failure to comply with the treatment requirements specified in Sections 64652,
3 64653 and 64654. The public notification format for violations of Sections 64652, 65653
4 and 64654 of the SWTR is included in Attachment A. Proof of Public Notification
5 (Attachment B) must be submitted to the Department within ten (10) days of disseminating
6 Attachment A.
7
8

9 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**
10

11
12 Based on the above Findings, the Department has determined that the Doyal's Mobile
13 Home Park Water System has violated provisions contained in Title 22, California Code of
14 Regulations (CCR) and in the California Health and Safety Code (CHSC). These violations
15 include, but are not limited to the following:
16

- 17
- 18 1. CHSC Section 116555(a)(3): Specifically, the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water
19 System has failed to ensure that a reliable and adequate supply of pure, wholesome,
20 healthful, and potable water is provided to all of its consumers.
21
 - 22 2. CCR Section 64652(a): The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System has failed to
23 provide multibarrier treatment that meets the requirements of the SWTR and
24 reliably ensures that at least a total of 99.9 percent (3.0-log) reduction of *Giardia*
25 cysts and 99.99 percent (4.0-log) reduction of virus is achieved through filtration
26 and disinfection.
27

3 3. CCR Section 64653(a): The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System has failed to
4 treat the approved surface water using conventional filtration, direct filtration,
5 diatomaceous earth filtration, slow sand filtration, or an alternative process
6 approved by the Department pursuant to sections 64653(a), (f), (g) and (h).
7
8 4. CCR Section 64654(a) and 64654(b)(1): The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water
9 System has failed to provide continuous disinfection treatment and hence has failed
10 to provide the necessary pathogen inactivation and to maintain a detectable chlorine
11 residual of 0.2 mg/l or greater in the distribution system pursuant to section
12 64654(a) and (b) (1).
13

14
15 **ORDER**

16
17
18 In order to ensure that the water supplied by the Water System is at all times safe,
19 wholesome, healthful, and potable, and pursuant to Section 116655 of the Health and
20 Safety Code, Doyal's Mobile Home Park is ordered to take the following actions:
21

- 22 1. Cease and Desist from failing to comply with Title 22, CCR Sections 64652,
23 64653, 64654, and CHSC Section 116555.
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26 2. By July 31, 2012, the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System shall submit to the
27 Department, for review and approval, a plan for improvements to provide an



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alternate source of potable water or to comply with all SWTR requirements and eliminate the need to deliver water to consumers that does not meet the treatment requirements as specified under the SWTR. The plan shall include a time schedule for completion of various phases of the project such as evaluation of alternatives, selection of project, design and construction and startup.

3. Effective immediately, the Water System shall provide notice to all users, in English and Spanish, notifying them to boil their water for drinking and cooking. The Water System shall immediately distribute the Boil Water Order, provided as Attachment A. The Boil Water Order shall be in place until such a time that a department-approved disinfection treatment is activated and achieves 4-log virus inactivation, as required under Directive No. 4 of this Order. Upon installation of the disinfection treatment required under Order No. 4 below, the Boil Water Order may be rescinded. The Water System shall provide proof that the Boil Water Order has been disseminated to all users, to the Department by May 4, 2012. A copy of a form to provide proof of notification is included as Attachment B. Should the Water System not submit the required proof of dissemination by the required deadline, the Department may distribute the Boil Water Order to the Water System's customers.

4. Until a permanent solution is completed, the Water System shall provide 4-log virus inactivation through continuous disinfection of the Well 01. The Department



1 will provide the Water System with the permitting requirements, necessary before
2 activation of any treatment or change in source, via a subsequent correspondence.
3

4
5 5. The plans for the chlorination system shall be approved by the Department prior to
6 any installation of equipment. The design and installation shall be completed by an
7 individual certified, at a minimum, as a T2 or D2 operator.
8

9
10 6. The Water System shall thereafter provide ongoing public notification to all
11 customers notifying them of the failure to comply with the SWTR by continuously
12 posting a notice in conspicuous locations and by direct delivery to each resident. The
13 first notice should be provided by May 20, 2012 informing users that the water does
14 not meet the filtration and disinfection treatment requirements of the SWTR. The
15 English version of the public notification is included in Attachment C. The Water
16 System shall provide proof of publication of the notification to the Department by
17 May 30, 2012. A copy of this form is included as Attachment D.
18

19
20 7. The Water System shall repeat public notification to all residents using Attachment
21 C by direct delivery until a project is completed to correct the problem. Proof of
22 public notification, using Attachment D, shall be submitted to the Department by the
23 10th day of the month following the issuance of the notice each calendar quarter.
24

25
26 8. The Water System shall submit quarterly progress reports to the Department, with
27 the first progress report due on September 30, 2012. The quarterly reports shall



1 discuss the progress the Water System has made to comply with the SWTR
2 filtration and disinfection requirements.
3

4
5 9. The Water System shall maintain, at a minimum, a T1 and D1 certified operator, in
6 accordance with Enforcement Letter No. 03-23-12E-008, issued by the Department
7 on January 30, 2012, for failure to maintain an appropriately certified operator. The
8 T1 certified treatment operator shall provide operational oversight and control of
9 the disinfection treatment required under Directive No. 4 of this Order.
10

11
12 10. The Water System shall submit a written response by May 11, 2012, indicating its
13 willingness to comply with the directives of this Compliance Order.
14

15 12. The Department reserves the right to make such modifications to this Order as it
16 may deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modifications may be
17 issued as amendments to this Order and shall be effective upon issuance.
18

19
20 13. All submittals required by this Order shall be addressed to:

1 14. If the Water System is unable to perform the tasks specified in this Order for any
2 reason, whether within or beyond its control, and if the Water System notifies the
3 Department in writing no less than five days in advance of the due date, the
4 Department may extend the time for performance if the Water System demonstrates
5 that it has used its best efforts to comply with the schedule and other requirements
6 of this Order.
7

8
9 15. If the Water System fails to perform any of the tasks specified in this Order by the
10 time described herein or by the time subsequently extended pursuant to Item 14
11 above, Water System shall be deemed to have not complied with the obligations of
12 this Order and may be subject to additional judicial action, including civil penalties
13 specified in II&S Code, Section 116725 and 116730.
14

15
16 16. The State of California shall not be liable for any injuries or damages to persons or
17 property resulting from acts of omissions by the Water System, its employees,
18 agents, or contractors in carrying out activities pursuant to this Order, nor shall the
19 State of California be held as a party to any contract entered into by the Water
20 System or its agents in carrying out activities pursuant to this Order.
21

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23 **PARTIES BOUND**

24
25 This Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Doyal's Mobile Home Park water
26 system, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, successors, and assignees.




The requirements of this Order are severable, and the Doyal's Mobile Home Park shall comply with each and every provision thereof notwithstanding the effectiveness of any provisions.

BOIL WATER ORDER

Este informe contiene información importante sobre su agua potable.

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Failure to follow this advisory could result in stomach or intestinal illness.

The well serving the Doyal's Mobile Home Park has been deemed groundwater under the direct influence of surface water and requires treatment that is not currently provided. Additionally, management has not conducted the required bacteriological water quality monitoring necessary to ensure that your water is safe. The California Department of Public Health is advising all users of the Doyal's Mobile Home Park water system to use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution.

Doyal's Mobile Home Park has been required to provide full treatment of the well water or find a replacement source of supply. Until a permanent solution has been identified, Doyal's Mobile Home Park will be required to provide adequate chlorine disinfection of the well water. This Boil Water Order will remain in place until the disinfection is installed.

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, **let it boil for one (1) minute**, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking and food preparation **until further notice**. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. This is the preferred method to assure that the water is safe to drink. An alternative method of purification is to use fresh liquid household bleach (Chlorox, Purex, etc.). To do so, add 8 drops (or 1/4 teaspoon) of bleach per gallon of clear water or 16 drops (or 1/2 teaspoon) per gallon of cloudy water, mix thoroughly, and allow to stand for 30 minutes before using. A chlorine-like taste and odor will result from this purification procedure and is an indication that adequate disinfection has taken place.

You will be notified when you no longer need to boil your water.
