ADDITIONAL SIGNIFICANT PROGRAM INFORMATION

The MMP was authorized through SB 420 (Chapter 875, Statutes of 2003.), to clarify provisions of Proposition 215, the Compassionate Use Act of 1996, and to create a medical marijuana identification card program for medically qualified patients and their caregivers.

The Program began in May 2005 with 3 pilot counties and expanded statewide in August 2005.
