What is a guidance?




The **Guidance(s)** refers to blueprints from CDC and HRSA to its grantees on how to conduct HIV planning; it provides flexible direction to design and implement a participatory HIV planning process.

Integrated Planning

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) currently issue separate guidances. Integrated HIV Planning Groups, such as this one, fulfill the obligations of both HIV prevention and care.

CDC and HRSA are working on joint guidance.
