- ⁶ Reflects HIV/AIDS-related expenditures by the Medi-Cal program. Expenditures for 2011-12 are estimates based on a growth factor of 5.0 percent from FY 2010-11. FY 2012-13 is estimated on a growth factor of 5.0 percent from FY 2011-12 and has also been reduced by 10% for expenditures after October 1, 2012 due to pending 10% provider reductions. These figures are difficult to project because Medi-Cal does not project AIDS costs separately from other Medi-Cal costs. In addition, the DHCS does not track AIDS-related expenditures for Medi-Cal eligibles that receive treatment in Managed Care systems, and so expenditures reflect Medi-Cal Fee-For-Service payments only. 2010-11 reflect the impact of enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage, pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009
- ⁷ On January 1, 2006, Medi-Cal HIV/AIDS beneficiaries that are also Medicare eligible were enrolled in a Medicare Part D plan and Medicare began paying for the majority of the beneficiaries drug need. Medi-Cal uses the percent of HIV/AIDS drug expenditures from calendar year 2003 of the expenditures of Part D drugs (4.26%) to estimate the HIV/AIDS related expenditures of Medi-Cal's Part D payments. On February 18, 2010, CMS announced enhanced FMAP provided under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 would be applied to states' Medicare Part D payments from October 1, 2008 - December 31, 2010.

1/ UC estimates that it will reduce funding for AIDS research in 2011-12. While UC's 2012-13 budget reflects continued funding of this 2011-12 amount, the Governor's Budget proposes to remove various set-asides for specific programs, including AIDS Research, to provide UC with greater flexibility to manage its \$750 million 2011-12 budget reduction. Thus, the funding level for AIDS Research in 2012-13 may be revised.

2/ Additional funding in 2012-13 for this and other mandates is available via a K-12 block grant.

3/ The expenditures for Perinatal SA/HIV Infants now fall under realignment. State General Fund share would have been \$136,000 for FY 2011-12 and \$139,000 for FY 2012-13.
