State Budget Update

- ▶ \$600,000 for school-based health centers
- ▶ \$5 million increase in STD funding
- ▶ Removal of Maximum Family Grant for CalWorks
- ▶ Scaling back Medi-Cal estate recovery

- ▶ \$2 billion No Place Like Home housing bond proposal

Federal Zika Funding

- ▶ No deal reached before summer recess
- ▶ \$1.1 billion to fight Zika was problematic
 - ▶ Used Ebola funds
 - ▶ Used PHEP funds
 - ▶ Poison pill about planned parenthood

State legislation

- ▶ Currently in recess
- ▶ Appropriations Committee upon return in August

Gun Bills Signed by Governor

- ▶ AB 1511 (Santiago): loans of a firearm may be made only to family members
- ▶ SB 880, (Hall) and AB 1135 (Levine): bans semi-automatic rifles with magazines that can be detached with a button
- ▶ AB 1695 (Bonta): mandates swifter reporting of lost or stolen firearms
- ▶ SB 1235 (de León): creates new regulatory framework for purchasing and selling ammunition
- ▶ SB 1446 (Hancock): bans magazines holding more than 10 rounds.

Gun Bills Vetoed by Governor

- ▶ AB 1176 (Cooper) to clarify that stealing a firearm is felony grand theft.
 - ▶ Already on the November ballot
- ▶ AB 1674 (Santiago) to limit long gun purchases to one per month
 - ▶ “burdening lawful citizens who wish to sell firearms that they no longer need.”
- ▶ AB 2607 (Ting) to expand those who are able to petition for restraining orders to include employers, coworkers, and mental health and school workers
 - ▶ “Premature.”
- ▶ SB 894 (Jackson) to make it an infraction to fail to report the theft or loss of a firearm.
 - ▶ Won't change behavior
- ▶ AB 1673 (Gipson) to expand the definition of “firearm” to curb homemade weapons created without serial numbers
 - ▶ Too technically broad

Opposed bills now dead

- ▶ AB 45 (Mullin) household hazardous waste
- ▶ AB 170 (Gatto) newborn genetic screening samples collected

Sponsored bill signed into law

- ▶ SB 1038 (Allen) TB testing in community college staff

Supported bills still in play

- ▶ AB 1554 (Irwin) Powdered alcohol
- ▶ SB 819 (Huff) Powdered alcohol
- ▶ AB 2424 (Gomez) Community-based Health Improvement and Innovation Fund

Supported bills still in play

- ▶ AB 470 (Chu) Pool drowning prevention
- ▶ AB 1546 (Olsen) Vital records banknote paper
- ▶ AB 1696 (Holden) Medi-Cal tobacco cessation services
- ▶ AB 1763 (Gipson) Colorectal cancer screening
- ▶ AB 2083 (Chu) Child death review team
- ▶ AB 2179 (Gipson) Hepatitis C testing

Supported bills still in play

- ▶ AB 2722 (Burke) Transformative Climate Communities Program
- ▶ AB 2796 (Bloom) Active transportation program
- ▶ AB 2892 (ESTM) Cholinesterase testing and reporting
- ▶ SB 32 (Pavley) Emissions limits
- ▶ SB 867 (Roth) Maddy Fund extension

Supported bills still in play

- ▶ SB 877 (Pan) Reporting and tracking of violent deaths
- ▶ SB 1238 (Pan) Prisoner medical data
- ▶ SB 1380 (Mitchell) Housing first model
- ▶ SB 1383 (Lara) Short-lived climate pollutants
