What HOAC Does

- Tracks 457 public health bills
- Tracks 87 priority bills
- Maintains a list of 576 health in all policies bills
- Maintains a list of 363 health equity bills
- Has positions on 24 bills

As of 3/24/16



Timeline

- Bills were introduced December through February
- Bills must pass out of committee within the next month
- Bills must pass their house of origin by June 3
- Budget must pass by June 15



Budget Items

- Lab Aspire
 - \$1.2 million per year for five years
- TB Elimination Challenge 2040
 - \$10 million per year
- Community Health Improvement and Innovation Fund
 - \$390 million per year for chronic disease prevention
