

CASES 8 & 9**ATYPICAL HAND, FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE (HFMD) – COXSACKIEVIRUS A6 (CVA6)**

PATIENTS: Five-year-old and three-year-old brothers

DETAILS: Developed similar symptoms within days of each other. Presented with maculopapular and scabbed rash on hands, feet, face (circumoral), groin, and buttocks. Other symptoms include pharyngitis, fever, and palatal petechiae. Separation of fingernails from nail bed began about 2 months after onset of symptoms.

OUTCOME: Presumed Coxsackievirus A6. No laboratory testing done.
