History of CFJC

CFJC was founded by the Community Food Security Coalition (CFSC) in 2003 to coordinate burgeoning food justice and policy efforts in California. CFJC became an independent project in 2008, and in 2011 moved to the Public Health Institute (PHI).



CFJC co-hosts a Farm Bill workshop in San Diego to relate the legislation to our daily lives.

Taking Back Our Food System

Beginning in the Bay Area, CFJC issued a call to action in California communities to Take Back Our Food System. Launched in November 2011, our call to action celebrates local food justice activities. As part of this call, CFJC hosts **Kitchen Table Talks** (KTTs) and lends logistical support to **Occupy Our Food System**, a group of organizations, community members, and activists working together to unify and amplify the food justice movement. Together, we can reform the way food is grown, produced, and distributed.



KTTs: Discussions at kitchen tables will identify solutions for making access to healthy food a reality for all.



Mothers Taking Action

We are partnering with the Network for a Health California, NORC, and the County Health Departments in Ventura and San Joaquin Counties on the pilot program **Mothers Taking Action**, comprised of food stamp-eligible mothers committed to improving the health of their families and communities. To date, CFJC has trained 44 Peer Leaders in Oxnard & Stockton who started walking clubs, procured land for a community garden, and facilitated dialogue sessions with over 500 other mothers.



Through Occupy Our Food System, residents and activists work to localize food production and put food back in the hands of the people.

Farm Bill 2012

In 2012, we are focused on the Farm Bill reauthorization process to ensure that food policy reflects the needs of California communities. We collaborate with local groups in **Farm Bill workshops** that help communities connect the dots between local priorities and national food policy. To link local concerns, solutions and actions with national reform, CFJC works with the **Healthy Farms, Healthy People** (www.hfhpcoalition.org), **Getting Our Act Together**, and **Food Equity Cluster** coalitions.
