Recommendation #1

(Passed by HAI-AC on 2/11/16)

CDPH survey all health professional schools and residency training programs in California (medical, dental, pharmacy, nursing, physician assistant, veterinary, podiatry, and optometry) to assess their current curriculum on antimicrobial stewardship and antimicrobial resistance.

Recommendation #2

(Passed by HAI-AC on 2/11/16)

CDPH send an advisory to (and/or support legislation that requires) all health professional schools and residency training programs in California (medical, dental, pharmacy, nursing, veterinary, podiatry, and optometry) to develop and implement an integrated antimicrobial stewardship/resistance curriculum and to submit a progress report within 2 years and every 5 years thereafter describing their progress in antimicrobial stewardship/resistance training and related initiatives at each school/program.

Recommendation #3

(Passed by HAI-AC on 2/11/16)

CDPH request that the Medical, Dental, Pharmacy, Physician Assistant, Registered Nursing, Podiatry, and Optometry Boards of California (and/or support legislation to) require that all licensed practitioners (including physicians, dentists, pharmacists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, podiatrists, and optometrists) complete at least 10 percent of all mandatory continuing education hours in a course in the field of antimicrobial stewardship, prescribing, and resistance.

AS/AR Subcommittee Discussion Items

- Compile list of health professional schools and residency training programs in California (including medical, dental pharmacy, nursing, physician assistant, veterinary, podiatry, and optometry)
- Develop letter and survey questions for CDPH to send out to these schools/programs to assess their current curriculum on antimicrobial stewardship and antimicrobial resistance

AS/AR Subcommittee Discussion Items

- Antimicrobial stewardship in long term care facilities (mandated by SB 361)
 - Development of 3-tier definition
 - Development of an ASP toolkit based on the components of the 3 tiers
