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Short-Term Out-of-State Travel for Bats (Re-Entry)

Animals subject to these provisions may re-enter California under a wild animal importation permit issued by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), Veterinary Public Health Section (VPHS), and upon payment of a \$10.00 permit fee per animal. Bats may not be imported until the consignee receives a permit issued by CDPH-VPHS. Persons wishing to import bats shall complete an importation permit application and provide CDPH-VPHS with the supplementary documentation listed below no less than five business days prior to importation:

1. A veterinary health certificate issued not more than 30 days prior to the first day of travel, certifying that the bat has been examined by a veterinarian accredited by the United States Department of Agriculture, and is free of signs of infectious diseases, and
2. Veterinary records of the bat, or the parents if less than six months of age, reflective of the 180 days prior to importation, and
3. A signed statement from the consignor describing the date and location of acquisition if the animal has been in the consignor's possession less than 180 days.
4. A signed statement describing the manner in which the bat will be maintained to preclude public and other animal contact while traveling, and
5. A detailed itinerary while traveling out-of-state.

Bats approved for out-of-state travel must remain in isolation except while the animal is being exhibited.

Bats permitted entry under these provisions shall not be sold, traded, or given away without notification and prior approval by CDPH-VPHS and the California Department of Fish & Wildlife.

Local Restrictions: An importation permit shall not be issued where local ordinances (city or county) prohibit the possession of the species. Importers must provide CDPH-VPHS with any applicable permit or licenses required by a local ordinance prior to the issuance of a wild animal importation permit.
