## Activity 2

### Origami Pinwheel

1. Start with the paper white side up.


Fold in half left to right.

Unfold.




2. Fold the left and right edges to the center crease.

Unfold.



3. Turn the paper one-quarter turn so that the creases are horizontal.




4. Repeat Steps 1 and 2:

(Step 1) Fold in half left to right. Unfold.


(Step 2) Fold the left and right edges to the center crease. Unfold.

You now have a 4x4 grid of little squares.



5. Make a diagonal crease by folding two opposite corners together.

Unfold.




6. Make another diagonal crease by folding the remaining opposite corners together.

Unfold and place paper white side down.




7. Fold all four corners to the center point.

Unfold and place paper colored side down.




8. Using existing creases, fold left and right sides to the center crease.




9. Using the existing creases, fold the inner edges of only the upper half down and out.



10. Collapse the upper half completely by folding the top edge down to the center crease. Fold the corners of the paper along the creases you made earlier.



11. Repeat with the lower half.



12. Fold two opposite triangles over so that all four arms of the pinwheel are facing the same direction.

**Optional:** Use a push pin to attach your origami pinwheel to a straw or pencil eraser. Do not push the pin in too tight. Leave it loose so the pinwheel can turn when you blow on it.

Open up the tip of each arm slightly to allow the arms to catch the wind and turn the pinwheel.
