

Certification Based on Dietary Assessment and Presence of Hematological Test Results

In **addition** to any other assigned risk codes (A, B, C or N), California WIC requires a complete nutrition assessment which must include the selection of at least one dietary risk to complete the eligibility requirement for all women, infants (4 months of age or older), and children.

The following flow chart provides guidance specific to completing dietary risk assessment when hematological test results are required.

Certification Based on Dietary Assessment and Presence of Hematological Test Results

When Hgb/Hct results are required...

If	And	Then
Hgb/Hct* results brought in *Must be Category specific blood	Any dietary code is identified <i>(D401/428 acceptable)</i>	Proceed with certification
Hgb/Hct not brought in	An acceptable dietary code is identified <i>(not D401/428)</i>	Proceed with certification
	The only dietary code used is D401 or D428 <i>(regardless of A,B, C or N codes used)</i>	Probe for other nutrition risk using Job Aid 960-02 or 960-03. If no other acceptable dietary code can be identified then applicant is not eligible for WIC; Suspend record until Hgb/Hct is brought in. <i>Please see note below for issuing FIs.</i>

Note: Codes of last resort D401 and D428 shall **only** be used when Hgb/Hct results are **present** and when no other dietary codes can be identified.

Issuing FIs: Staff may issue one month of FIs only if the PPT is still within the previous certification period.
