CROSS FILING INFORMATION: If you meet the entrance requirements for this classification and for Communicable Disease Specialist II and/or Communicable Disease Manager III scheduled at the same time, you may file for all three exams on a single application. You must indicate the class title(s) corresponding to each examination for which you are applying on the application Form STD. 678. You will not be considered for additional classes after the final filing date.

FINAL FILING DATE: Applications (Form STD. 678) must be submitted by **October 31, 2008** the final filing date. Applications postmarked, personally delivered, or received via interoffice mail after the filing deadline will not be accepted.

SPECIAL TESTING INFORMATION: If you have a disability that requires accommodation, mark the appropriate box on the application Form STD. 678. You will be contacted to make specific arrangements.

ORAL INTERVIEW DATE: It is anticipated that oral interviews will be scheduled during **November** and in such locations throughout the state as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. If a candidate's notice fails to reach him/her prior to the date of the QAP due to verified postal error, he/she will be rescheduled upon written request.

SALARY RANGES: \$5079.00 - \$6127.00 per month.

IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENT: Accepted applicants are required to bring either a photo identification card or two forms of signed identification to each phase of the examination.

POSITION DESCRIPTION: The Communicable Disease Manager II is responsible for all phases of local communicable disease programs within a very large and complex geographical area, i.e., the northern or southern half of the State or all or all of Los Angeles County. Incumbents supervise Communicable Disease Specialists I - II/Managers I, "Communicable Disease Representatives" or Federal or county assignees. The incumbent has program and budget responsibility for communicable disease programs within an assigned area.

Positions exist with the Department of Public Health Sacramento/Richmond.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION: It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement by **October 31, 2008**, the final filing date. Your signature on your application indicates that you have read, understood, and possess the basic qualifications required.

NOTE: Applications/resumes **must** include "to" and "from" dates (month/day/year), time base, civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course information **must** include title, number of semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree (if applicable).
Applications/resumes received without this information will be rejected.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the following requirements include more than one pattern and are distinguished as either I, or II, or III, etc.

Either I

Experience: Two years of experience in the California state service as a Communicable Disease Specialist I or Communicable Disease Manager I.

OR II

Experience: Five years of experience as a medical service corpsperson dealing with communicable diseases or as a communicable disease representative or investigator in a local, state, or federal health agency. Four years of this experience must have been in an administrative or supervisory capacity with responsibility for the planning, implementation, or evaluation of a significant phase of a communicable disease control program;

And

Education: Equivalent to graduation from college. (Additional supervisory or administrative experience may be substituted on a year-for-year basis for two years of the required education.)

SPECIAL PERSONAL REQUIREMENT: Willingness to travel throughout the State.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS: In addition to the scope defined on this announcement, candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION: The examination will consist of a Qualification Appraisal Panel interview that is weighted 100%. The interview will include a number of predetermined job-related questions. Competitors who do not appear for the interview will be disqualified and eliminated from the examination process.

INTERVIEW SCOPE: In addition to evaluating the candidate's relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis will be placed on measuring, relative to job demands, each competitor's:

Knowledge of:

1. Knowledge of general disease prevention, epidemiology principles and analysis of communicable diseases and related public health problems.
2. Knowledge of modes of transmission and diagnosis treatment and out break response.
3. Knowledge of principles and techniques of field investigations contact tracing, and community mobilization.
4. Knowledge of program assessment, planning, and evaluation of communicable disease control.
5. Knowledge of principles and practices of public health organization, fiscal management, and personnel administration.
6. Knowledge of State and Federal laws and regulations governing local communicable disease programs.
7. Knowledge of principles of supervision.
8. Knowledge of Equal Opportunity Employment (EEO) objectives.

Ability to:

1. Ability to develop cooperative and harmonious relationships with local health departments, providers and communities in the course of disease prevention and control work.
2. Ability to assume and demonstrate independent responsibility for multiple decisions and actions having regional implications on program objectives and activities.
3. Ability to analyze situations accurately and take effective action.
4. Ability to speak and write effectively to a diverse audience.
5. Ability to develop and implement program policies, standards, and procedures.
6. Ability to organize, coordinate, oversee and supervise the work of staff to address multiple program activities.
7. Ability to convene and facilitate work groups or teams.
8. Ability to maintain a professional non-judgmental attitude, and confidentiality in the work place.
9. Ability to prioritize activities in a fast paced, multidisciplinary work environment.
10. Ability to develop and provide TA and guidance in regards to Communicable Disease and intervention at the local level.
11. Ability to provide mentoring and training to local communicable disease staff to improve capacity.
12. Ability to train, develop and supervise project and program staff; effectively contribute to the department's Equal Employment Opportunity action objectives.
13. Ability to assess resources and infrastructure, and organize and coordinate interjurisdiction safety net and surge capacity for disease intervention at the local, regional levels.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION: Possession of the entrance requirements does not assure a place on the eligible list. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. A departmental open list will be established for use by the department(s) listed on this announcement. The list will expire 24 months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first.

VETERANS PREFERENCE: Veterans preference credits will not be granted in this examination since it does not qualify as an entrance examination.
