WHO SHOULD APPLY: Persons who meet the minimum qualifications (entrance requirements) as stated on this announcement may take this examination, which is competitive.

CROSS FILING INFORMATION: If you meet the entrance requirements for this class and/or for Public Health Nutrition Consultant II and/or Public Health Nutrition Consultant III (Specialist) and/or Public Health Nutrition Consultant III (Supervisor), you may file for all examinations on a single application. Indicate the class title(s) for which you are applying in the appropriate section of the application.

FINAL FILING DATE: The testing office has established the following application cut-off date: February 15, April 15, June 15, August 15, October 15 and December 15. Submission of applications after the cut-off date will not be accepted for the current examination, but will be held for the next scheduled examination.

TESTING PERIOD: A candidate may be tested only once during any testing period. The testing periods for this classification are January 1 through December 31.

SALARY RANGES:

Range A: \$3378-\$4419 per month. This range shall apply to all incumbents who do not meet the criteria for payment in Range B and is considered a trainee level.

Range B: \$3788- \$4957 per month. This range shall apply to persons who have satisfactorily completed the equivalent of 12 months of Range A experience or who have met the alternative range criteria outlined in the class specifications. This is the first working level.

POSITION DESCRIPTION: Under close supervision, as a trainee, incumbents will be given training to develop and strengthen skills in interpretation, application, consultation, and program planning in public health nutrition, and to gain experience as a public health nutritionist at the State level. Incumbents will be required to perform the more routine assignments in order to apply the principles and methods of public health nutrition, and to develop the knowledge and skills necessary for the successful performance at the first working level.

At the first working level, incumbents work under supervision in an assigned geographic area or special subject matter area. Incumbents provide the less complex nutrition, administrative and program consultation, evaluation, and technical assistance to public and private institutions and agencies on the delivery of nutrition related services; plan, evaluate, and monitor the less complex nutrition services, programs, and studies; participate in the development and evaluation of nutrition and program policies, procedures, and standards; assist in developing, coordinating, and conducting training programs; assist in the more complex health programs, studies, or reports; and other related work. Positions are permanently allocated to this level when the major portions of tasks performed do not include the more responsible, varied, and complex work of the full journey level.

Positions exist with the Department of Public Health in Sacramento County.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION: It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement on the date you submit your application. Your signature on your application indicates that you have read, understood, and possess the basic qualifications required.

NOTE: Applications **must** include “to” and “from” dates (month/day/year), time base, job titles and/or civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course Information **must** include title, number of semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree. **Applications received without this information will be rejected. Applicants must submit a copy of official transcripts along with the application when using education to meet the entrance requirements for this examination.**

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Possession of a valid certificate of registration with the Commission of Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association.

AND

Possession of a Master’s Degree in Nutrition, Dietetics, Institutional Management, or Public Health Nutrition.

NOTE: Applications must show the date of the applicant’s notice of eligibility for registration from the Commission on Dietetic Registration, the registration number, title, and expiration date must be on their application. (Applicants who are eligible for registration will be admitted to the examination, but they must secure the required certificate before they will be considered for appointment.)

DESIRABLE CHARACTERISTICS: Willingness to travel in an assigned area or throughout the State, work irregular hours, and possession of a valid driver’s license.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION: The examination will consist of a Qualifications Assessment and is the sole component of the Public Health Nutrition Consultant I examination. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received. The Qualifications Assessment is designed to elicit specific information regarding each candidate’s education, training, and experience relative to the testing classification. Responses to the questionnaire will be assessed based on pre-determined rating criteria. The Qualifications Assessment package will be emailed to the applicant in the form of a survey.

The California Department of Public Health reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

SCOPE: In addition to evaluating the candidate’s relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis will be placed on measuring, relative to job demands, each competitor’s:

Knowledge of:

1. Principles of normal and therapeutic nutrition.
2. Recommended food requirements based on body needs for different age and occupational groups.
3. Expectant mothers and lactating women, and others with special food requirements, such as the chronic and terminally ill.
4. Environmental, sociological, cultural, and biological factors which influence food practices.
5. Nutrition and its application in the dietary control of disease as applied in public health programs.
6. Methods and techniques used in nutrition investigations and dietary studies.
7. Principles of program planning.
8. Principles of food safety and sanitation.
9. Educational methods in training others in the principles of nutrition and their application to various phases of public health programs.
10. Community and public health nutrition programs.
11. Comparative costs of various foods in relation to their nutrition values.
12. Health organizations, resources, and current social/ economic problems pertaining to public health nutrition.
13. Principles of group feeding and institutional management.
14. Consultative techniques.
15. Principles, programs, and practices of public health administration at national, State, and community levels.
16. Principles and methodology of research and statistical analysis.

Ability to:

1. Learn, interpret, and apply State and Federal rules, regulations, policies, and procedures.
2. Effectively provide consultation and technical assistance.
3. Establish and maintain the confidence of and productive working relationships with other health disciplines, agencies, organizations, and the public.
4. Communicate nutrition knowledge for application by other disciplines and the public.
5. Analyze menus and diets for nutritional adequacy.
6. Reason logically and creatively.
7. Analyze situations accurately and take effective action.
8. Develop and effectively utilize all available resources.
9. Be flexible in approach to the solution of problems.
10. Develop and evaluate alternatives.
11. Implement and evaluate less complex programs, studies, and projects.
12. Conduct assigned portions of conferences, workshops, and training programs.
13. Communicate effectively.
14. Prepare reports.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION: Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. Names of successful competitors are merged into the open eligible list established for use by the Department of Public Health in order of final scores regardless of testing date. Eligibility expires **24** months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first

VETERANS' PREFERENCE: Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows: 1) Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference; 2) An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination; 3) Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.
