NOTICE OF REPEAL OF TEMPORARY FOOD DELIVERY SYSTEM REGULATIONS

As of June 1, 2021

Effective Dates and Regulation Updates

This Notice informs stakeholders about changes affecting WIC minimum stocking requirements in California.

As of June 1, 2021, all Temporary Food Delivery System Regulations will terminate and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) will require all vendors and vendor applicants to meet the minimum stocking requirements specified in WIC Bulletin Regulations section 71100.

Authority

CDPH is repealing the Temporary Food Delivery System Regulations pursuant to:

- (1) <u>Executive Order N-40-20</u>, which allows temporary changes to CDPH's regulations governing food delivery systems; and
- (2) 7 Code of Federal Regulations part 246.12(g)(3)(i), which requires State agencies to establish minimum requirements for the variety and quantity of supplemental foods that WIC vendors and vendor applicants must stock to be authorized.
