<u>AB 1487</u>	Hill	Requires the California Department of Public Health (Laboratory Field Services) to adopt regulations no later than January 1, 2014 and would allow CDPH to adopt initial regulations based on the "Guidelines for Reducing Risk of Viral Transmission During Fertility Treatment" (American Society for Reproductive Medicine). Includes other provisions that require the patient to provide documentation on other physician care during and after completion of fertility services, including provision of medical guidelines for testing after use of sperm from an HIV or HTLV reactive donor.	Enacted September 29, 2010.
<u>AB 1701</u>	Chesbro	Continues current provisions which permit cities and/or counties to authorize the Disease Prevention Demonstration Project (over the counter syringe sales) and require pharmacies that wish to participate to register with their local health department. Adds a sunset date of December 31, 2018.	Enacted January 1, 2011.
<u>AB 1766</u>	Gaines	Extends the sunset date of Placer County consolidated contract pilot program. Provisions become inoperative July 1, 2016 and repealed January 1, 2017.	Enacted January 1, 2011.
<u>AB 1858</u>	Blumenfield	Would permit CDPH to authorize certain entities, that meet prescribed conditions, to provide hypodermic needle and syringe exchange services in any location where the department determines that the conditions exist for the rapid spread of HIV, viral hepatitis, or any other potentially deadly or disabling infection spread through the sharing of used hypodermic needles and syringes. Adds a sunset date of January 1, 2016.	<u>Vetoed.</u>

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AB 2039	Logue Would delete the dates upon which the Placer County Integrated Health and Human Services pilot program becomes inoperative and is repealed, this extending its operation indefinitely. See AB 1766 (adds back the intent of AB 2039)	Vetoed.
AB 2541	Portantino Deletes the exemption from electronic reporting for HIV infections by laboratories; permits providers and local health officers to electronically submit HIV case reports; and allows the further disclosure of HIV/AIDS-related public health records by local and state public health agencies to other local, state, and federal public health agencies for the specific purposes of complete HIV/AIDS reporting, facilitating appropriate HIV/AIDS medical care and treatment, and facilitating appropriate medical care and treatment for HIV, TB, syphilis, gonorrhea, or Chlamydia co-infections.	Enacted January 1, 2011.
SB 0853	Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review Allows HIV testing sites to provide rapid HIV testing with HIV counselors trained by the California Department of Public Health, Office of AIDS regardless of funding source.	Enacted October 19, 2010.
SB 1029	Yee Would end the Disease Prevention Demonstration Project (over the counter syringe sales). Would expand access to sterile syringes by authorizing nonprescription syringe sale through licensed pharmacies throughout the state and permitting customer purchase a possession of up to 30 syringes for personal use when acquired from an authorized source. Would require pharmacies to provide safe syringe disposal and OA and Board of Pharmacy to provide relevant information for customers via the Web. Adds a sunset date of December 31, 2018.	Vetoed.
