SUBJECT: **ADDITION OF INFLUENZA VACCINES TO THE PrEP-AP FORMULARY**

**Effective January 23, 2023**, the following influenza vaccines have been added to the PrEP-AP formulary: Afluria<sup>®</sup>, Fluad<sup>®</sup>, Fluarix<sup>®</sup>, Flublok<sup>®</sup>, Flucelvax<sup>®</sup>, Flulaval, Fluzone<sup>®</sup>, Fluzone<sup>®</sup>-High Dose. The addition of these influenza vaccines will provide PrEP-AP clients with more treatment options to protect against the influenza virus.

In addition to being available in pharmacies, influenza vaccines will also be available to PrEP-AP clients for administration in a clinical setting.
