## SUBDIVISION 2. ADMINISTRATION CHAPTER 2.05 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH - CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

AMEND Section 20100.5 to read as follows:

## 20100.5 General Provisions.

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Califomia Code of Regulations, Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings. Therefore, the terms of 2 Califomia Code of Regulations, Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, along with the attached Appendix A, in which officials and employees are designated, and Appendix B in which disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Department of Public Health.

The Director and copies of statements for appointed members of multimember boards and commissions must file their statements of economic interests electronically with the Fair Political Practices Commission. All other individuals holding designated positions must file their statements with the Department. All statements must be made available for public inspection and reproduction under Government Code Section 81008. Designated employees shall file statements of economic interests with the Department of Public Health. The Director's original statement and copies of statements for appointed members of multi-member boards and commissions shall be sent to the Fair Political Practices Commission. A copy of the Director's statement along with the original statements for the commission and board members shall be retained by the filing officer of the Department of Public Health.
